Wireless Emergency Alerts

Wireless Emergency Alerts are government emergency messages sent to individual wireless cellular devices through FEMA's messaging infrastructure known as the **Integrated Public Alert & Warning System (IPAWS).** The alerts are issued under the following categories:

- 1. Emergency threats and threatening weather
- 2. Amber Alerts
- 3. Presidential Alerts during a national emergency

WEA messages include a special tone and vibration to differentiate them from other messages that can be received on your cell phone. The messages can be generated by governmental agencies at the federal and local level based on a set of rules and regulations. Cell phone carriers pass the WEA messages onto all subscribers. There are no messaging charges to receive these messages.

Cell phones must contain special circuitry to receive WEA messages. Phones manufactured after 2012 will likely have the circuitry to receive WEAs. Older phones cannot be retrofitted to receive these messages. If you have one of the newer phones capable of receiving alerts, you most likely do not need to take any action to receive these messages. Phones can be configured so they do not receive emergency and amber alerts, if desired, by making the appropriate adjustments in the phone's settings file. Presidential alerts cannot be turned off, however.
